### 1. Presentation of AGE

#### What is AGE?

- ▶ a network bringing together European, national and regional non-profit organisations of older people working with, and for, older people
- ▶ set up in January 2001 following a process of discussion on how to improve cooperation between older people's organisations at EU level
- ➤ a non-profit international association, financed by membership fees and an annual subsidy from the EU Commission (PROGRESS: EU's latest employment and social solidarity programme)



## AGE at a glance

- ▶ Gathers 140 associations from 27 EU Member States:
  - 114 Full Members (9 Europe-wide organizations and 105 national- or regional-level associations)
  - 18 Observer Members (NGOs located outside EU, regional and local authorities, research centres etc.)
- ► Represents 25 million older people across Europe
- ▶ Promotes and defends the interests of 150 million older people in Europe
- ► A network that keeps on growing!



### **Finance**


Under the PROGRESS Program, the EU Commission funds <u>4 European social networks</u> defending the rights of people subject to discrimination (on the basis of gender, age, disability, race, religion and/ or sexual orientation):

- AGE
  - ILGA-Europe (European Region of the International Gay and Lesbian Association)
  - **ENAR** (European Network against Racism)
  - **EDF** (European Disability Forum)

## 2. AGE Objectives

- ► <u>To voice and represent</u> the interests of older and retired people *vis-à-vis* EU institutions
- ► To improve dialogue and cooperation between its members and the EU institutions
- ► <u>To support networking</u> among older people's groups in Europe
- ► <u>To disseminate information</u> among its members and influential decision makers
- ► <u>To cooperate</u> with other European NGOs



### 3. AGE Activities

# Policy influencing and development – 6 political priorities

- Non-discrimination
- ► Employment of workers > 50, active ageing
- Social inclusion and fight against poverty
- ► Social protection (pension reform, minimum income)
- ► Health care and long-term care of the elderly
- ► New technologies, Accessibility and transport
- Active Participation of older people, including the most vulnerable



## **Eurobarometer survey**

#### Relevant data

The most recent Eurobarometer survey, carried out in the EU Member States, about Discrimination in the EU in 2012, revealed that:


- 45% of Europeans believe <u>age discrimination</u> is <u>widespread</u>.
- 67% believe the <u>economic crisis</u> is contributing to <u>more discrimination</u> against workers aged 55 +.
- 54% believe that a job applicant's age is a disadvantage if he/she is over 55.

#### Raising awareness

Fair treatment is a basic right in the EU. In principle, it is illegal to discriminate on the grounds of a person's age. Yet EU citizens are not fully aware that they are legally protected against discrimination. Since 2003, the EU has been supporting an information campaign "For diversity. Against discrimination " across Europe, to make more people aware of their rights and responsibilities.



# Age discriminations in work places and job research are the most frequent



## HOW AGE - PLATFORM ANSWERS? NGO POLITICAL DECLARATION

By the NGOs contributing to UNECE Ministerial Conference on Ageing 19-20 Sept. 2012, Vienna

- Much has to be done to achieve the aims and objectives of the Madrid International Plan of Action on Ageing (MIPAA)
- NGOs were recognised as playing "a significant role in representing people and their needs in society and thus can contribute to policy making";
- Member States need to implement the three priority actions of MIPAA that they themselves have agreed:
  - older persons in development;
  - advancing health and wellbeing into old age;
  - ensuring enabling and supportive environments



By the NGOs contributing to UNECE Ministerial Conference on Ageing 19-20 Sept. 2012, Vienna (cont. 'd)

### **NGOs URGE UNECE Member States to:**

- Protect the rights of older persons by: enforcing legislation that already exists; promoting good practice that enables older persons to understand and claim their rights; strengthening national, regional and international human rights legislation
- Eliminate poverty and inequality among older persons by: ensuring adequate incomes, including universal access to non-contributory pensions and equal access to essential goods and services;

## NGOs URGE UNECE Member States to:

- Facilitate access to decent work and adequate pay for persons of all ages by: abolishing mandatory retirement ages; eliminating discrimination on the basis of age for access to work and pay across the life course; implementing flexible working practices that meet the needs of older persons; supporting retraining programmes for older workers; supporting older workers in the informal sector;
- Guarantee access to lifelong learning across the life course, recognising that access to affordable high-quality education, informal and non-formal learning for people of all ages is necessary for older persons' participation in society, increasing social inclusion and reducing discrimination
